

Cigarette butts are the most littered item in the U.S. and around the globe. Cigarette litter is also toxic waste that pollutes land and water and can be eaten by fish and other marine life, and even children. KMB and 13 other coastal organizations and state parks have joined together for a summer-long awareness and prevention campaign focused on the problem of cigarette litter with a message of "Georgia's Coast is Not an Ashtray." The campaign, funded by a grant from Keep America Beautiful, includes installing new cigarette receptacles in Darien and locations near water throughout McIntosh County, store window signs, pocket and car ashtray giveaways, public service videos, and a special "coaster" activity in bars and restaurants in the county on Friday, August 24. The new Todd Grant Elementary School Classroom includes a greenhouse contributed by Keep McIntosh Beautiful, that KMB volunteers also helped assemble. Beginning this fall, the greenhouse will be used by all grades at the school and for McIntosh County 4-H projects. The Outdoor Classroom is a work in progress but already includes areas for math, reading, music, art, a weather station, and planting boxes along with the greenhouse. The project is being coordinated by TGES art teacher and long-time KMB Board Member Kelly McClellan and funded with a "Bright Idea" grant from Coastal Electric Cooperative.

Abandoned Building Program UPDATE

KMB was able recently to assist owners in removing two more buildings through its Abandoned Buildings Programs – a badly burned mobile home in Darien and a neglected property in the county.
